Ben's practice is primarily civil based, though he deals with childcare and family matters as well as regulatory crime. Ben also takes a particular interest in POCA applications.

Within his civil practice Ben regularly advises and appears in cases involving personal injury, contractual disputes, land disputes (including rights of way and the like), trusts, and licensing (with particular emphasis on hackney carriage and private hire). Ben also deals with landlord and tenant matters (commercial and residential), probate, insolvency and commercial, consumer credit and banking. Ben is predominantly concerned before the County and High Court in fast and multi-track matters, though has experience of the Court of Appeal. Ben accepts instructions on behalf of both Claimants and Defendants (private and CFA). In particular within his personal injury practice his practical Opinions, as well as what has been described as "tenacious advocacy", have fuelled the speed with which his practice has developed to one beyond that ordinarily associated with a barrister of his call.

Ben's licensing practice concentrates on taxi and private hire areas and encompasses all aspects including judicial review of policy decisions affecting the trade.

Ben's rapidly growing family practice involves public and private childcare as well as ancillary relief. Ben regularly represents parents as well as Children through their Guardians, wider family members and interveners in childcare disputes. Ben has a personal, yet firm approach.
